





ABOUT KAZAKIKSTAN

Kazakhstan is the world's largest landlocked country, and the ninth largest in the world, with an area of 2,724,900 square kilometers (1,052,100 sq mi). It is a transcontinental country largely located in Asia; the most western parts are located in Europe. Kazakhstan is the dominant nation of Central Asia economically, generating 60% of the region's GDP, primarily through its oil/gas industry. It also has vast mineral resources.

Kazakhstan is officially a democratic, secular, unitary, constitutional republic with a diverse cultural heritage.[16]
Kazakhstan shares borders with Russia, China, Kyrgyzstan,
Uzbekistan, and Turkmenistan, and also adjoins a large part of the Caspian Sea. The terrain of Kazakhstan includes flatlands, steppe, taiga, rock canyons, hills, deltas, snow-capped mountains, and deserts. Kazakhstan has an estimated 18.3 million people as of 2018. Given its large land area, its population density is among the lowest, at less than 6 people per square kilometer (15 people per sq mi). The capital is Astana, where it was moved in 1997 from Almaty, the country's largest city.

The territory of Kazakhstan has historically been inhabited by Turkic nomads who trace their ancestry to many Turkic states such as Turkic Khaganate etc. In the 13th century, the territory joined the Mongolian Empire under Genghis Khan. By the 16th century, the Kazakh emerged as a distinct group, divided into three juz (ancestor branches occupying specific territories). The Russians began advancing into the Kazakh steppe in the 18th

century, and by the mid-19th century, they nominally ruled all of Kazakhstan as part of the Russian Empire. Following the 1917 Russian Revolution, and subsequent civil war, the territory of Kazakhstan was reorganized several times. In 1936, it was made the Kazakh Soviet Socialist Republic, part of the Soviet Union.

Kazakhstan was the last of the Soviet republics to declare independence during the dissolution of the Soviet Union in 1991. The current President, Nursultan Nazarbayev, has been leader of the country since then, and is characterized as authoritarian, with a government history of human rights abuses and suppression of political opposition. Kazakhstan has worked to develop its economy, especially its dominant hydrocarbon industry. Human Rights Watch says that "Kazakhstan heavily restricts freedom of assembly, speech, and religion", and other human rights organizations regularly describe Kazakhstan's human rights situation as poor.

Kazakhstan's 131 ethnicities include Kazakhs (63% of the Kazakhstan's 131 ethnicities include Kazakhs (63% of the population), Russians, Uzbeks, Ukrainians, Germans, Tatars, and Uyghurs. Islam is the religion of about 70% of the population, with Christianity practiced by 26%. Kazakhstan officially allows freedom of religion, but religious leaders who oppose the government are suppressed. The Kazakh language is the state language, and Russian has equal official status for all levels of administrative and institutional purposes. Kazakhstan is a member of the United Nations, WTO, CIS, the Shanghai Cooperation Organization (SCO), the Eurasian Economic Union, CSTO, OSCE, OIC, and TURKSOY.

Almaty, Kazakhstan's largest metropolis, is set in the foothills of the Trans-Ili Alatau mountains. It served as the country's capital until 1997 and remains Kazakhstan's trading and cultural hub. Landmarks include the Central State Museum, displaying thousands of historic Kazakh artifacts. In the center is Panfilov Park, home to the bright-yellow towers of Zenkov Cathedral, a tsarist-era Russian Orthodox church.

From June 26, 2020, he was appointed to the position of the First Vice Minister of Healthcare of the Republic of Kazakhstan.

Our lab has manikins for skills such as CPR, intramuscular injection, catheterisation, suture procedure etc. We organise hands-on training sessions for students throughout the year.

In KazNMU, Lecture Hall and Rooms are architecturally and aesthetically well designed and are well ventilated. The furniture in the rooms is specially designed for comfort sitting of the students. In addition to the traditional blackboards, to make the teaching-learning process multidimensional, multimedia over-head projectors and LCD projectors are used. - Kazakhstan is the 9th largest country by size in the world. It's a huge place with a very small population of only 16 million people.

- Kazakhstan is landlocked, but it has a naval force, which is based on the similarly landlocked Caspian Sea.
- Most of the country is extremely flat and barren. This is the famous "steppe" (semi-arid and generally without trees, this area is extremely hot in summer and very cold in winter).
- The country is nominally Muslim, but there are few outward signs of this. Mosques are not frequently seen

- or heard. The many years of Soviet rule, when religion was downplayed, have diluted its importance in the country as a whole.
- Kazakhstan is the 9th largest country by size in the world. It's a huge place with a very small population of only 16 million people.
- The Downtown in Astana has relatively new city with a fancy, over-the-top skyline!
- War heroes' monument is located in Almaty and Uralsk as memory of the lost ones during the World War II.
- Kazakhstan is home to the Baikonur Cosmodome, the world's first and largest space launch facility. It is leased by the Russians until 2050.
- About 0.5% of the population is of Korean descent.

- The New Year for Kazakhs is called Nauryz, and it is celebrated on the 22nd of March.

 of the water remains saline, whereas the other half of
 the lake has fresh water.
